








A Message from the Executive Director, Andrew Gentzow



This past year has been one of reflection and appreciation for all the teachers and administrators, both past and present. Many of the traditions at Kids' Corner were already in place long before I started working for the organization in 2004. Events such as the Italian Feast before Thanksgiving, Halloween Shorts, and the WOW Awards were traditions that I got to enjoy my first year working as a part-timer in the K-1 Room. They showed me early on that the teachers at Kids' Corner were dedicated and engaged like no other program I had been a part of before.

Over the years, teachers have come and gone or changed roles within the organization but that dedication to our mission statement has always persisted. Everyone who has moved on has left their mark on those here today. Those who participated in the first ever Fenway Day, who gave out the first prizes on Carnival Day, who created the first 456 Room yearbooks, etc. are the ones who laid the groundwork for what we do. Year after year the teachers keep these traditions going, make improvements, and create new ones.

No event demonstrates the dedication of past and present staff more than the Haunted House. The Haunted House started as a cardboard maze just for the kids when I first arrived at Kids' Corner and has since been transformed into a much bigger wood structure that the community comes to enjoy. The walls and black fabric were painted by teachers over the years. When I see all the different designs, I remember each and every staff member who painted them. It becomes a physical representation of our history with all the love and care that is shown each and every day by the staff.

I am eternally grateful for all the teachers and administrators who have worked at Kids' Corner and the group of parents who came together in the early 1980s to establish the organization. The culture that was created years ago is still alive and well. The faces change but our commitment to the mission of Kids' Corner persists.

Average Cost per Special Event The average cost for performers this school year came out to about \$1,041, while the average cost for field trips was about \$1,043. This cost can include admission & bussing. We had an impressive line-up of special events, some including Tanglewood Marionettes, Bubble Mania, Roller Kingdom, & Waterpark of New England!

Tuition is the primary revenue source while staff salaries are the largest program expense. This school year, budgeted salaries rose by 23% thanks to an increase in revenue outside of tuition. This means that parents were able to continue paying low, stable tuition rates for our high quality afterschool program.

September 2023 - Friendship

After the students got acclimated at Kids' Corner, we introduced the core of our curriculum including projects and Big Group Game. We were also excited to start enrichments such as Karate, Gymnastics, 3-D Design, Singapore Math & Hip Hop!

We had an early release day and organized a party based around our monthly curriculum theme of friendship. The classrooms rotated through three different activities: friendship bracelets, puzzle-creating, and team-building active games.



October 2023 - Fall-o-ween



October featured fun activities like three early release days in a row, Halloween Movie Night, Haunted House, & Halloween Shorts!

During the early release days, the kids were able to go on fun field trips within their classrooms (Smolak Farm for K-1, Omni Theater at the Museum of Science for 2-3, & Boda Borg for 4-5-6), watch a performance by Bash the Trash, & participate in Fall-o-Ween Games respectively.

We also hosted our 4th annual Halloween Movie Night community event and raised over \$1,348 for our programs! Towards the end of the month, we ran our annual Haunted House community service project, and raised \$491 for the Woburn Council of Social Concern's Thanksgiving baskets!

Finally, each room filmed & edited their own films for Halloween Shorts throughout the month. By the end of October, we were able to watch them all together.

November 2023 - Community

We started off the month with two Full Day Programs during Election Day & Veterans Day. On the former, The K-1ers had fun exploring endless tunnels, slides, ball pits, and mazes at One Stop Fun. The 2nd-6th graders played arcade games and enjoyed the rock walls and ropes courses at In The Game. For Veterans' Day, the entire program went to Sky Zone. The kids got to bounce their hearts out. They enjoyed the foam pit, the trampolines and playing dodgeball with their friends!

We also hosted another community service project called Coin Wars. Each class places their money jug out for parents and caregivers to donate money for two weeks. There is a point system and friendly competition involved. Afterwards, we count up the money and points. The classrooms decided this year to donate all the proceeds to Rock n' Rescue. We raised \$585!





At the end of the month, we all enjoyed our annual Italian Feast. The whole program gathered together in the gym and we feasted upon baked ziti, salad, rolls, and of course, brownie sundaes! Yum!

We ended the month with our Giving Tuesday Fundraiser which was super successful. We raised \$12,015 and each classroom earned a pizza party for meeting their participation goal of 65%! Across the program, we had 71% of families participate. Incredible!



December 2023 - Celebrations

This month was full of traditions at Kids' Corner! We enjoyed our Dreidel Tournament, cooking-decorating and gingerbread house-making! All the classrooms enjoyed Reindeer Games as well! For the first time since 2018, the K-1ers sang holiday songs in person for the residents at The Gables. The 4-5-6 Room had an epic holiday party with a ton of awesome food. We also had a Celebrations Around the World Day where the students rotated through three different activities and heard stories, learned some history, created crafts and played games. They learned about Diwali and the festival of lights, the history and importance of pinatas in Mexico, and the Winter Solstice legend of the Oak King versus the Holly Queen.



January 2024 - The Arts



January was incredible and full of fun activities. The 2nd-6th graders started their Mini Courses; we had a great selection this year from sports and sewing, to sculpting, coding and more! Additionally, the K-1 group enjoyed their Micro Courses which included puppet-making, melty beads and tape art.

Towards the end of the month, we also hosted our fourth annual PJ Bingo Night community engagement event. We had our biggest turn out yet with about 150 people and raised \$2,376 toward staff development.

We had two early release days with special performers. We were delighted to have comedic juggler Bryson Lang join us for our first performance. Tanglewood Marionettes joined us for the last performance of the month and they wowed us with a tale called An Arabian Adventure. This performance is supported in part by a grant from the Winchester Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Mass Cultural Council, a state agency.

February 2024 - Space

We wrapped up our Mini Courses in February and had a few good days of outdoor play in the snow. The 2-3 Room spent a lot of time organizing, planning and executing their biannual Kids Town engineering project.

For February Vacation, we adventured all over! The K-1 Room enjoyed bouncing and playing arcade games at Xtreme Craze, as well as exploring and learning at the Boston Children's Museum! The 2nd-6th graders seeked some thrills snow tubing at McIntyre Ski Area and playing arcade games and winning prizes at Funworld. The entire program enjoyed watching Disney on Ice at TD Garden and on Friday, we all enjoyed watching the movie Migration and eating some tasty pizza.





March 2024 - Animals & Creatures



In March, we offered a Full Day Program on the 6th and had a great turn out. The whole program went to Town Line Luxury Lanes in Malden and bowled to our hearts content! The kids had fun making their own teams, eating delicious pizza, & bowling either the classic way or with exciting mini-games!

We had three early release days. On our first day, we enjoyed a performance from Bubble Mania where we learned the science of bubbles and a few tips and tricks for bubble-making. On our second day, we had a blast at Roller Kingdom where we enjoyed skating with our friends and singing along to karaoke Our final day was spent on-site at Kids' Corner and we had a special visit from Professor Bugman who taught us all about arthropods. We got to meet and touch beetles, millipedes and more!

The 4-5-6 Room had a special visit from our friends at Studio on the Common and they got the chance to create their own pinch pots. They formed and painted them, then returned home with a fired, colorful and glazed piece.

April 2024 - Camping & Survival

We hosted our 5th Annual Epic Night Out fundraising event on the 6th. We had a glow theme this year with super fun games, raffles, auctions & more! We raised \$9,500 that will be used toward curriculum enhancements, STEAM initiatives and staff professional development.

We were also treated to a special nature event this month - the solar eclipse! Students and staff went outside in shifts with special glasses to witness the event. Teachers did special craft activities and documented the progression of the eclipse.

During April Vacation, the K-1ers enjoyed field trips to The Ecotarium & Amazement. The 2nd-6th grade group had a blast on their trips to Battleship Cove & Beaver Brook. We had a couple of joint field trips to Shriner's Circus & Simonds Park.



May 2024 - Challenges



We started the month with classroom field trips! The K-1ers enjoyed a perfect day seeing animals and playing on the playground at Franklin Park Zoo. The 2-3 Room combined their field trip with a community service project by going to the Fells to pick up trash along the trails. They hiked all the way up to Wright's Tower to take in the view! The 4-5-6ers had the best time at Rockport shopping and enjoying some independence.

The K-1 Room and 4-5-6 Room wrapped up the year with community service projects as well. The former ran a book swap and any remaining books were donated to the Enka Fair Book Tent. The latter also hosted an amazing bake sale, baking an array of sweet goodies and selling them for several days, donating their \$430 profits toward the Home for Little Wanderers.

Towards the end of the month, our whole program visited Water Park of New England where we enjoyed the water slides, the sprinklers, the pools and the fun obstacles.

June 2024 - Deja Review

We ended the year with all of our incredible traditions. As a program, we enjoyed an Ice Cream Sundae Party, Carnival Day, Move Up Day, End of the Year Video and Fenway Day! The 456ers won this year 13-12!

Each classroom had their traditional celebration. The K-1ers enjoyed WOW Awards, the 2-3ers had a blast at Graduation Day & the 4-5-6ers reminisced during their Yearbook Party.

The Summer Program enjoyed another successful summer!

We had a lot of returning staff from last year and three new staff members this summer. These were a mix of high schoolers, college students, alumni, and Kids' Corner teachers.

For summer enrichments, we brought in karate from Bay State Martial Arts, gymnastics, Top Secret Science, Lego Challenges, On the Mark Archery, Kidstock!, as well as traveling to It at Portland Adventure Ropes Course at Jordan's Furniture. Some staff also brought amazing activities like baking, art/crafts, music, theater, and sport enrichments to the program.

Field trips are contingent on weather, and the Wednesday weather was not in our favor this year. On rainy days, we had some fun alternative activities like indoor hide and go seek and a movie day watching the movie "Wish". On one particular hot day, we had a massive water play day.

We did have some perfect weather days sprinkled in there and we enjoyed trips to Stage Fort Park, Launch Trampoline Park, Nelson Beach State Park & Hampton Beach State Park.

We also had three fun theme parties this summer with different crafts and games. We had themes such as Olympics, Under the Sea and Space! KC Xtreme had another successful summer in 2024, full of travel and new experiences. We successfully navigated around hiccups in the schedule and rainy days.

With long hours and very active trips, our staff did a great job stepping up, and keeping our kids engaged. We often have three to four staff members on schedule for each trip; a combination of seasoned KC staff and college students.

We like to keep our group sizes small so that the wait time and quality of trips goes a lot smoother. The experiences we share become more intimate and meaningful to the kids when they aren't waiting in long lines, giving them more time to take part in the trip. I also found that the kids bond more quickly and have a sense of camaraderie faster. It also gives the staff more time to get to know each child individually. Our group sizes this year ranged from 21-34 kids. Of those who participated each week, around 50% of the students are alumni from our After School Program.

The trips were fantastic this year. Some of the highlights were our Boston trips (Codzilla and Whale Watching with a Faneuil Hall hang out), kayaking, surfing, Mt. Cardigan hike, white water rafting, theme parks, indoor skydiving, and Rockport, to name a few. We made the best of rainy days by heading to arcades and bowling. Overall, it was a wonderful summer and the students had a blast!
